TOP TIPS FOR SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S READING

- ▼ It is essential to read to your children everyday. A story at bedtime each night builds vocabulary, understanding and a love of books, as well as being a lovely way to unwind at the end of a busy day and spend time together.
- Ideally, hear your child read everyday. This may be very short and brief and does not need to be the whole of their reading book.
- Remember to praise and keep it a very positive experience.
- ▼ Try to find books that the children are interested in.
- Books do not need to be expensive. Second hand books shops, online retailers and even supermarkets such as the Book People often have good quality books at very reasonable prices.

If your child is finding reading difficult or you would like some advice. Please speak to your child's teacher.

TUESDAY 2ND OCTOBER READING AND PHONICS MEETING RECEPTION PARENTS 9AM OR 6PM

All reception parents are invited to attend one of the meetings on Tuesday 2nd October at either 9am or 6pm.
