Dear Parents/ Carers.

We pride ourselves in St Margaret Mary's Catholic Infant School on being a 'family' who care for and support all of our members. Unfortunately, we have serious concerns about abusive and aggressive language being used by adults in and around school premises and sometimes in-front of children. There have been a number of incidents where parents have spoken to members of our school community including staff and other parents in inappropriate ways; raising their voice, swearing and shouting. We are aware that this is a very small minority, however, abusive and aggressive language or behaviour is not something that we want to see in St Margaret Mary's Infant School.

We all want the very best for the children in our care and if there is a misunderstanding or difference of opinion, or if someone has made a genuine mistake, then please work with us to resolve any concern you may have. If there is a concern about another child in school, please bring it to us. Do not approach their parents, as even when done with the best of intentions, this often leads to upset.

Anyone who uses abusive and aggressive language will be asked to leave the school premises or the telephone conversation will end. Parents may face a temporary ban from the school premises. Furthermore, this ban will be extended for repeated or extreme cases. Any threats or actual abuse will be reported to the police.

The Complaints Procedure conforms to the Ofsted guidelines on handling complaints and is designed to be fair to all parties – children, parents, guardians and staff. All of the details are in the Complaints Procedure on the school website.

Thank you to the majority of parents and guardians within our school community for their continued support, who behave appropriately at all times and are probably shocked and surprised by the need for this to be included in our newsletter.
