

NEURODIVERSITY WEEK

This week in school, we have been celebrating Neurodiversity week. We have learned about autism, ADHD, down syndrome and dyslexia and celebrated how everyone is unique and everyone is special and wonderful! Holy Week

The days and week before Easter, also known as Holy Week, can be a wonderful time of encouraging children to understand the significance of the days before Christ's crucifixion and the resurrection. Holy Week is the week before Easter, beginning with Palm Sunday and ending on Easter. Next week in school, we are focusing on teaching children to embrace Easter and Holy Week.

Palm 'Monday' 25th March in school.

Palm Sunday (24th March this year) marks the beginning of Holy Week, the day Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on a donkey. The day is called 'Palm Sunday' because the people of Jerusalem threw palm leaves to the floor as a greeting when he arrived.

On Monday, the children will listen to the story of Palm Sunday and make 'palms' in class. We will then greet 'Jesus' on the playground and wave our palms, just as the people of Jerusalem did.





The Last Supper - Tuesday 26th March in school.

We remember that at the Last Supper (28th March this year), Jesus washed his friends' feet and said, "I have given you an example of what you must do."

On Tuesday, each class will take part in prayer and liturgy, listening to and acting out washing feet and the story of the Last Supper. We will wash the children's feet, just as Jesus did to his friends.

Calvary and Stations of the Cross – Wednesday 27th March in school.



We remember Jesus died on Good Friday (29th March this year). On Wednesday, the whole school will listen to and look at the Stations of the Cross (simplified, child friendly version). As the children go forth, they will be given a flower to put at the foot of the cross.

We would like to invite parents/carers to bring their own flowers to put at the foot of the cross on Wednesday as you bring the children to school in the morning to be part of this special occasion. Thank you.

THE IMPORTANCE OF READING WITH CHILDREN

Children love to hear stories. It fires their imaginations and allows them to visit places and people which they may not get to explore otherwise. It widens a child's understanding of the world, their vocabulary and their own reading skills. The modelling of reading from anyone who is more skilful than they are provides something to aspire to and model their own reading after.

A few minutes everyday listening to an adult they have a close relationship with read a story is a loving and calming experience, especially before bed. After a busy day, it is a time to relax and ready a child's mind for sleep.

All the research tells us that the most powerful thing a parent can do to boost their child's academic progress is to read to their child. Each child takes home a bed story book each week. It's a book that they have chosen themselves to share with you.
