Age	Average daytime naps	Average night time sleep	
3 months	5 hours	13 hours	
4 to 12 months	4 hours	11 hours	
1 to 3 years	approx. 2 hours 30 minutes	11 hours	
3 to 4 years	1 hour or suitable rest time	10 hours 30 minutes	
5 to 7 years	No sleep– but may still require rest time	10 to 12 hours


