### **READY FOR LEARNING**

A good night sleep is extremely important for children to be at their best in school. It is recommended for children between the ages of 3 and 7 need between 11 and 13 hours of good quality sleep. Watching any kind of screen before bedtime means that the brain is not ready for recharging sleep for two hours. Children who are tired in school find it difficult to concentrate for long periods and so may find learning a challenge.

Stories at bedtime are a great way to relax and wind down after a busy day and help your children to be ready for sleep. Reading stories together are a great way to introduce your children to lots of new words, new places and new experiences without leaving their room. Books are an affordable gift. Many places including the book people and local supermarkets sell books at an affordable cost and of course it is free to borrow books from the library.
