There have recently been a number of confirmed cases of **scarlet fever** in children attending Knowsley schools.

The **symptoms** of scarlet fever include;

- a sore throat,
- headache,
- fever,
- Possibly nausea and vomiting,
- Rash fine red rash which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. On more darkly-pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'.

Children or adults displaying the symptoms should stay at home for at least 24 hours after starting antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection.
