## ADMISSIONS Reception 2021

The window for admissions for Reception 2021 has now opened. It your child will be four before September 2021, you must apply for the place in Reception.

This includes children who may already be in our nursery .

Applications can only be made online with both Knowsley and Liverpool.

The closing date for all application is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021. Offer letters will be sent on or around 16th April 2021.


### IMPORTANT REMINDERS and MESSAGES

- Children should not bring a school bag unless it is absolutely necessary.
- Only one adult should come to school to collect and drop off.
- Please do not pass messages on at the door. Please contact the school office via telephone or email.
- Please queue to enter school across the front of the club and around church. Where possible, please stand on a path.
- Please only arrive at the correct time and leave the school grounds quickly.
- Please ensure your child brings a labelled water bottle to school each day.
- Adults need to wear a face coverings while on school premises.
- Please keep your children with you on the yard when dropping off or picking up.

## EARLY YEARS Importance of Talking

Research shows that talking to young children is so important to child development.

- ♥ Talk about anything and all the time.
- ▼ It builds the brain.
- Talking about the world, about people and about what they are doing develops understanding, vocabulary, personal skills and enables children to express themselves.



We have begun to send reading books home. Here are some top tips for reading with your child.

- 1. Read something every day
- Read to your child; share stories, poems, magazines, anything.
- Let your children see you reading; be their model
- Keep it short for some children 10 minutes everyday is great. Quality time is better than a long time.
- 5. Find a quiet space; away from screens and noise.
- 6. Use the pictures to help.
- Ask simple questions about what they have read.
   (Sometimes there are ideas at the back of the book).
- 8. Praise the effort.
