ALREADY HAD YOUR FIRST JAB?

If you've had your first jab, you can attend the clinic to get your second jab provided there has been at least eight weeks since your first dose. The walk-in clinics stock the Pfizer vaccine.

NOT AVAILABLE WEEKENDS?

KEEPING GETTING TESTED

Once you've had your vaccine it is important you still regularly test for COVID-19. The vaccine protects you from the virus, but you might still be able to carry it and pass it on.
