READING WITH YOUR CHILD



Children love to read and to be read to. In school, we share books with children throughout the curriculum.

Sharing a story at bedtime is an important and simple way to have a big impact on your child's education.

A little bedtime reading each night is proven to help a child's development in many different ways. You don't need to read for very long, put on fancy voices or even be very good at it. The most important thing is to just read together. Reading each night will help to;

- Expand vocabulary
- Expand knowledge and understanding of the world.
- Develop concentration.
- Develop word recognition and phonics
- Develop comprehension skills.
- Help to calm and relax a child, ready for sleep as part of a bedtime routine.
