Traffic and Parking

On Friday, a meeting was held at the junior school to discuss the issues around the dangerous parking on Pilch Lane during the morning and afternoon drop off and pick up time. Local councillors and representatives from both Liverpool and Knowsley council attended.

The following actions have been agreed;

- 1. Increased patrols and on the spot fines from local traffic officers and police.
- 2. Re-paint zigzag lines on the roads
- 3. Replace signage

A meeting will be held in the following weeks to update us and to feedback about other options.

I am sure we all agree the situation on Pilch Lane is dangerous. It is a very difficult situation as there are almost 1000 children plus their family members coming and going to school within a very short time. The church car park was closed due to a 'near miss' with a young child. We frequently receive complaints from neighbours and our parents about people who have parked dangerously or illegally and also about a child who has nearly been knocked over. Unless action is taken, there may be a serious accident.

What you can do to help?

- 1. If you can, walk to school.
- 2. Or, if you can, park further away from the school buildings. For example, at Dovecot Shops.
- 3. If you must drive all the way to school, do not park on the zigzags, on pavements or across neighbours driveways.
- 4. If you must drive all the way to school, please always be extremely cautious when pulling away from the kerb.
