

NURSERY APPLICATIONS

If your child turns three before the 1st September 2022, they will be entitled to 15 hours free nursery provision.

For working parents, your child may be entitled to 30 hours free provision.

Our nursery offers both 30 hour and 15 hour places.

The installation of our new early years outside provision has begun. Please be careful when on the school site. Please be aware that access routes may change so that the work can continue.

PARENTAL CONDUCT

There have been several concerns raised recently about parents speaking to each other and to our staff in ways which are not acceptable.
